

Curriculum Feedback Faculty 2019-2020



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


CURRICULUM FEEDBACK BY **STUDENTS 2020-21**




FACULTY FEEDBACK

Curriculum Feedback Faculty 2022-23







Curriculum Feedback Alumni 2022-23




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PARENTS FEEDBACK

So for example, all those who select a 4 (i.e. agree) are assumed to be evenly distributed between 3.5 and 4.49. Similarly all those who select a 5 (i.e. strongly agree) are assumed to be evenly distributed between 4.5 and 5.49. The median is then calculated from these transformed responses.






